

Clinton Township Board of Trustees – Regular Meeting
August 5, 2019 – 7:00 p.m.

All Board members answered roll call – Trustee James Distel, Trustee Dennis Baugher, Trustee Dennis Moyer, and Fiscal Officer Jennifer Bates.

Guests: Fred Bishop, Steve Welter, Penelope Christian, and Dennis Kingseed.

The minutes of the meeting held July 22, 2019 were read and approved.

Fire Chief Fred Bishop reports that Finley Fire is coming to do the pump tests tomorrow, August 6th. New Riegel is bringing their trucks also.

Zoning Inspector Steve Welter reports that he issued a pool permit to Chris Weimerskirch. He also received a phone call from Chris Magers from Clinton Heights Golf Course who purchased the lots that were sale in front of the course. He would like to put in a practice facility and asked about the zoning. It is currently zoning Agricultural, so he would need to apply for a conditional use permit. Zoning Inspector Welter also received a phone call from a resident who says that there is a lot on Eighth Ave. that needs to be mowed.

Penelope Christian from Regional Planning discussed the countywide Transportation Improvement Plan that she is working on. She needs information on any projects that we are planning in the next five years so they can look at possible grant funding opportunities. She would like the information by August 16th or August 23rd at the latest.

Trustee Baugher reports that they finished hauling the dirt from Sentinel last Friday. Also, regarding propane pricing, he says Central Ohio Farmer’s Co-op does a first fill for \$1.19 and caps the price at \$1.38 after that.

Trustee Moyer says he spoke to Alex Daniel at the fair, and he says that if we get a membership with Sunrise, we can save 8-12 cents on propane. The cost for the membership is \$25. Trustee Moyer made a motion to change our propane supplier to Sunrise Cooperative and to purchase their membership. This was seconded by Trustee Baugher. Mr. Moyer – yes, Mr. Distel – yes, Mr. Baugher – yes.

Trustee Moyer reports that he spoke to Bob Wisebaker who says there is a washout around a basin out at Autumnwood between 450A and 451. He also reports that M&B Asphalt will be paving Honeycreek over the next three days. They will wait and do the rest after they grind.

Trustee Moyer asks if we should pave the driveway approaches on TR 122 where the tile went in, or if we should wait until the other side of the road is done as well. Trustee Baugher says the other side will need to settle so we should do them next year. He also says that we need to get grass planted. Trustee Moyer says we need to change a tile out over there also.
